



About "*The Shaken Table*"

Tabla Rasa Gallery is delighted to present "*The Shaken Table*," featuring 15 new watercolor paintings by Peter Gergely. Dr. Gergely's whimsical works take "going green" to a new dimension. This collection of off-beat botanicals was conceived especially for his first solo showing at Tabla Rasa Gallery in Brooklyn, New York.

With a seemingly effortless gesture and application, he masters illusionistic veracity. This is an impressive achievement in what is generally agreed to be the most difficult medium in which to paint.

An avid gardener, Peter Gergely is often drawn to home-grown subjects. Appearing to start with an orderly arrangement, the beans and vegetables seem to have a will of their own, as they defy conforming to the plan, bringing to mind the wisdom of eighteenth century Scottish poet Robert Burns. In "To a Mouse," Burns wrote: "The best laid schemes o' mice an' men / Gang aft agley." (The best laid schemes of mice and men / Go oft awry.)

Peter Gergely, a Hudson Valley Pediatrician, was born in Nahant, Massachusetts and received his B.A. at Dartmouth College in New Hampshire and his medical degree at Tufts University Medical School in Boston, Massachusetts.

Always a watercolorist, his first major project was a series of 150 original illustrations for The Way We Garden Now by Katherine Whiteside, published by Random House in 2007.

There will be an artist's reception on opening day, Saturday, April 16, 2011 from 6:00 until 8:30 pm.

"The Shaken Table" will remain on display through June 4, 2011.

Tabla Rasa Gallery is free and open to the public.

The gallery is located, at 224 48th Street, between 2nd and 3rd Avenues.

About Tabla Rasa Gallery

Tabla Rasa Gallery is located in the burgeoning art district of Sunset Park, Brooklyn. The destination gallery is known for their consistently stunning exhibitions. Within the 4000 square foot turn of the century carriage house, the gallery exhibits primary and secondary market artwork by emerging, mid-career, and established artists, in all media, including painting, sculpture, installation, drawing, print media, digital, film and video.

The gallery is located two "D" or "N" express subway stops from Manhattan to 36th Street Station, plus one "R" stop to 45th Street (or a just few short "R" stops beyond Park Slope).

Directions to Tabla Rasa Gallery

Subway: From Manhattan, take D or N to the Brooklyn 36th St. station plus one R stop to 45th St.

Driving: Tabla Rasa is on 48th St between 2nd and 3rd Aves, Brooklyn.

Ample street parking is available
